Creed

Sacraments

- In the sacrament of penance/reconciliation we say we are sorry for our sins and receive God's forgiveness. (Family Life lesson 7)
- The Eucharist was begun by Jesus at the Last Supper as a sacrificial meal.
- In the Eucharist, bread and wine are changed into the body and blood of Christ.
